resh air, warmer weather and blooming flowers. What's not to love about spring, and what's not to love about no yearly tax increase? Richland Township Supervisors adopted a budget for the year 2025, with no tax increase while balancing the budget despite increasing costs. Being fiscally responsible with our tax dollars, while continuing the same high-quality services our residents have come to appreciate, is a top priority for us in Richland Township.

One example of a cost saving measure was the total renovation of the municipal meeting room, and updates to the bathrooms and lobby that were in need of repairs and also increased energy efficiency. Hundreds of thousands of tax dollars were saved on labor and material costs by having the work done in-house by a very talented public works employee. The lobby was remodeled using repurposed wood that was donated for free from

a local barn demolition. The Township playground was upgraded with funds received through a grant award from DCNR. We have also applied for additional grant funding to renovate our well-loved and highly-used Pickleball Courts. That project will be scheduled for later in the year.

It has been an honor to serve as your Township Supervisor, wholeheartedly confronting challenges head on to protect you and our community. Efforts to stop the sale of Bucks County Water & Sewer Authority that would have significantly increased costs for our residents were successful.

When a developer filed a validity challenge to our zoning map to expand the development areas in our Township, we stood our ground, and their appeal was denied by the Zoning Hearing Board. As of this writing, there are several Pennsylvania House Bills being proposed in Harrisburg to revise the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code (MPC) that takes away local government control and would have a direct impact on the zoning in our community. These bills include:

HB 2045: This legislation would revise the Municipalities Planning Code to require cities, boroughs, towns and townships with more than 5,000 in population to permit the use of duplex, triplex and fourplex housing in areas currently zoned for single-family residences only.

HB 1976: This legislation would revise zoning laws to allow multi-family housing and mixed-use development in urban areas zoned for office, retail and parking with existing water and sewer systems.

Local zoning is a long-held and time-tested power of local government used to not only protect the health, safety, and welfare of citizens, but also to shape the extent of development and the character of a community. We are working with our State Representative Craig Staats and have joined forces with the Bucks County Association of Township Officials, and the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors, in opposing the legislation.

As your Township Supervisor, I will continue to work to protect our community and remain a diligent watchdog to ensure that our tax dollars are spent wisely. I want to express my sincere gratitude to the residents of our Township for giving me this opportunity to serve you.

FROM THE TAX OFFICE

Bucks County and Richland Township have not increased taxes for 2025. The combined Bucks County/Richland Township property tax bills are issued on March 1st. Your bill contains useful information regarding your parcel and payments. The tax year for the County/Township bill is the calendar year. The school bills follow the school fiscal year from July 1st to June 30th and are labeled according to the year they are issued.

On the County/Township bill there are two copies of the bill on the page. The middle section is your copy and can be retained by you for your records. The bottom section is the Tax Collector copy to be included with your payment. If you want a PAID receipt for your records, send the Taxpayer (middle) copy along with the Collector

copy and include a stamped, self-addressed envelope. I will stamp, sign and return your copy. You will need the signed copy if you apply for the property tax rebate. State Representative Staat's office can assist with the rebate program.

The school bills are issued on July 1st. Also on the school bill are two copies, the top and bottom thirds of the page. The middle third should be returned to me with the first installment only if you choose the three-payment plan. You do not get the discount if you choose the installment plan. If you want a PAID receipt for your records, send the Taxpayer (top) section along with Tax Collector copy and include a stamped, self-addressed envelope.

There is a 2% discount available if you pay the County/Township by April 30th , and the school bill by August 31st. In order to receive the discount, the check must be received by that date, or the envelope postmarked by that date or the electronic payment entered by that date. For your convenience, I have included a return envelope with this year's bill.

Appearing on the bill are the taxing authority and the millage collected by each. One mill represents one dollar of tax for every thousand dollars of assessed value. Your assessed value is shown on the bill and is determined by the Bucks County Board of Assessment. The assessment value is calculated by taking the fair market value at the time of assessment and dividing it by the

ratio determined by the Commonwealth each July. Currently, if you divide your assessment by .067 you will have approximately the fair market value as determined by the County. If you reasonably believe that the resulting amount is too high, you may appeal to the County.

If you have not received your bills within a week of the mailing dates above, please call me. If you change your mailing address, please keep me informed, in writing, of the correct address. QUAKERTOWN FIRE DEPT. ANNUAL REPORT

The Quakertown Fire Department has released it's 2024 fire report. The Quakertown Fire Dept. composed of Quakertown Fire Co. #1 – Station 17 on W. Broad St. and West End Fire Co. #2 – Station 18 on Park Ave. in Quakertown responded to 742 requests for service in 2024. This total consisted of 663 fire, 47 fire police, 8 QRS, and 24 Dept. Officer dispatches by Bucks County Radio.



Days with the most fire calls were Wednesday with 107 followed by Monday with 106. Types of fire dispatches were 109 automatic fire alarms, 76 building/dwelling fires, 70 accident stand-by and a variety of fire calls for brush, vehicle rescues/rescues, automobile/truck, fumes inside/outside, wires inside/outside, chimney, CO alarm, dumpster/rubbish, and others type fires or assists to other departments resulting in the 663 fire dispatches and total manhours expended of 4,538. The Quakertown Fire Dept. is 100% volunteer members responding to emergencies 24 hours a day, 365 days of the year. Volunteers are equipped with pagers and utilize the Active 911 system on their personal phones for notification of emergency dispatches.

In 2024, the Department consisted of 3 engines, a ladder truck, rescue truck, chemical/cascade truck, field truck, 2 utility trucks, a traffic unit, and 4 chief officer vehicles. Miles logged by apparatus were Engine 17 – 2,442, Engine 17-1 – 1,817, Chemical 17 – 1,761, Ladder 18 – 1,906, Squirt 18 – 1,940, and Rescue 18 – 1,073. The department has established a minimum 20-year replacement schedule for the major fire-fighting apparatus, 15 years for the ladder truck and 25 years for the rescue and chemical trucks. Replacement schedules are designed to reduce the financial burden that could develop in the replacement of aging apparatus. All the apparatus is equipped with the latest and most efficient equipment for the multitude of emergencies the department is dispatched. Station members clean and maintain the apparatus and emergency equipment.

The Quakertown Fire Department serves Quakertown Borough, significant portions of Richland Township, and portions of East


Rockhill Township. In addition, mutual aid is provided to fire companies in neighboring boroughs, townships, Montgomery, Lehigh, and Northampton counties. Training is provided through Bucks County Fire School, other certified trainers, department, and station training. The Department, in addition to this training, conducts department and station drills.

All of the proceeding totaled an additional 6,645 manhours for the volunteers in 2024. Monthly station and department meetings add additional manhours.

The Department in 2024 operated on a budget of slightly more than \$700,000 dollars. Finances for the department are met by financial assistance provided by Quakertown Borough, Richland Township, East Rockhill Township, fire station annual letter drive donations, insurance company fire insurance subsidies, general donations, grants, and individual station fund raisers. Annually the Fire Department hosts a carnival held in early June 2025 to raise funds. All department and station fund raisers require additional time to be donated by volunteers.

The Quakertown Fire Dept. is extremely thankful to the numerous dedicated men & women who volunteer to serve their community when volunteer fire service is suffering in Pennsylvania. The department still needs volunteers to serve as firefighters and fire police. Anyone 18 years of age and older can volunteer by stopping at either station, Monday is drill/meeting night, to inquire or pick-up an application. The department has a junior firefighters program for youth ages 14-17 and auxiliaries who assist the stations with programs, fund raisers, and community events. The department stations welcome visitors interested in learning more about emergency services, the apparatus, the equipment used by our volunteers, and fire safety. The officers and volunteers of Quakertown Fire Department are pleased and proud to serve you.



Richland Township Community Garden 2025 SIGN UP FORM

Richland Township is currently offering garden plots in our community garden which is located at:

402 Station Rd, Quakertown, PA 18951

The plots are approximately 10x7 feet. Please park in the area in front of or behind the One-Room Schoolhouse on Station Road. Access to the gardens is currently through a path in the treeline. We may add additional access in the near future.

Plots will be available to work on beginning APRIL 15th There is currently no rental fee associated with use but space is limited. Please note: there is no water currently at the site, so it is a BYOW facility. (We currently have a water collection barrel that will be available for use but dependent on rain conditions.) Each gardener is responsible for making his/her own accommodations and may use the rain barrel on a first come, first serve basis.

The following rules are designed to ensure that you and your fellow gardeners have a pleasant and productive season. Please take a moment to review them.

Reserving a plot:

- Plots are reserved on a first-come first-served basis.
 Return this form to the Township office Monday to
 Friday from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm., or mail in the form to the address below.
- · Garden plots are not rented to commercial growers.
- Gardeners may not sublet or give away their plots. If you no longer wish to garden, please contact the Township office during normal business hours.
- · Any plots not occupied by July 1st will be reassigned.
- Please clean up after yourself. Richland Township will not provide trash services.

Plot Maintenance:

- All gardeners are to maintain their plots in a reasonable manner. Weeds and garden debris can serve as cover and food for undesirable insects, rodents, and other vermin.
- · Gardening is permitted from dawn to dusk.
- · No fertilizer or commercial pesticides are permitted.
- · No shade producing plants over 4' tall are permitted
- No corn permitted.
- Fencing and plant supports are permitted but please refrain from using metal as it may damage the tilling equipment.
- · No permanent structures or fencing is permitted.
- Tools, supplies, and related gardening equipment left at a garden plot site are left at your own risk and must be left in a tidy manner and within your plot limits.

Your Responsibility to Fellow Gardeners:

- Please do not block garden paths with vehicles, equipment, or debris.
- · Highly invasive plants are not allowed.
- Please be aware of larger shade producing plants.
- be sure to include a valid email for information, communication, and updates.

End of Year Responsibilities:

Remove all non-organic materials including fencing, stakes, and rain barrels.

Please note: Abuse of the above rules will result in the denial of future rentals.

We participated in Richland Township's Community Day, loaned our three Atkinson paintings to the Richland Library Company in Quakertown for their art exhibit this summer, had our first guest speaker, Dr. Robert Leight, who spoke about The Evolution of One-Room Schools (1720-1956), had our first program by Francine Schmitt on antique Christmas ornaments and we hosted our 27th Let Freedom Ring bell-ringing event on July 4 with 73 attendees.

The Society had its first fundraiser at The Proper Brewing Company located in Quakertown. We hope to have you join us again this year another night of great food! When the date is set, we will post it on the website, **www.richlandhistoricalsociety.org**.

We hosted our 65th Homecoming. Guest speakers included State Representative Craig Staats and Supervisor Kathie Doyle. Staats presented the Society with a Proclamation from the PA House of Representatives recognizing the importance of the work we do. We will resume a tour program this spring and will provide the community with programs at our normal meeting time on the 3rd Sunday at 2 p.m. Both dates will be posted on the website.

Our new website provides the community with news of our events and history of the one-room school system in Richland Township, and we will soon have PayPal available on our website to make payments for memberships. Our landscaping had an overhaul, a new sign was installed, and we renovated the girls' outhouse. The Bucks County Intermediate Unit's students assisted with extensive cataloging of our library and inventory of historic items, organizing our museum, painting, planting and mulching that gave the grounds and buildings a new, fresh look. PRESERVATION IN RICHLAND TOWNSHIP 2025

THE RICHLAND TOWNSHIP PRESERVATION BOARD



At the end of 2024, the Richland Township Land Preservation Board had preserved 38 farms and properties in the Township with easements, property donations, and fee-simple purchases, for a total of over 1,350 acres protected. Now, that's some preservation progress.

But what does 'protected' mean?

Properties with an easement that will protect the open space are not for public access, unless specified. When a landowner chooses to put an easement on their property, it means that certain restrictions will be put on the acreage that is to be preserved to protect it. First, development is restricted in the area that is protected. It also means that the streams, woodlands, and soils are protected with various restrictions spelled out in the easement. The landowner is compensated per acre on the area to be preserved.

Most easements state protection of the land to the landowner as such: "to assure the Easement Area will be retained forever in its agricultural and open space condition and to prevent any use of the property that will significantly impair or interfere with the conservation value of the property", which includes protecting the woodlands, plant and animal life, streams, wetlands, and valuable soils of the farm fields. This agreement follows the property deed in perpetuity. And for this, the property owner is compensated to ensure the land is protected.

The Township has a monitoring program to ensure that the conditions are followed, and monitoring is conducted every two years by Heritage Conservancy. It is a partnership with the property owner that helps to protect the preserved property from encroachment and other forms of trespassing.

In 2025, the Preservation Board's main goal is to continue to promote the program and make sure that owners of farmland and natural areas are aware of the Township's program. Properties over 25 acres are preferred unless there are unique natural amenities or is adjacent to already preserved land. The Preservation Board works closely with Heritage Conservancy, a non-profit land conservation organization.

We also can offer guidance on Bucks County's Farmland Preservation Program and how to apply. For this program farms must be 35 acres or more and actively farmed, as well as be a member of our Agricultural Security Area.

There is still a lot of open space left to protect in Richland Township to help our rapidly growing community maintain balance.
